2017 – Groove Music

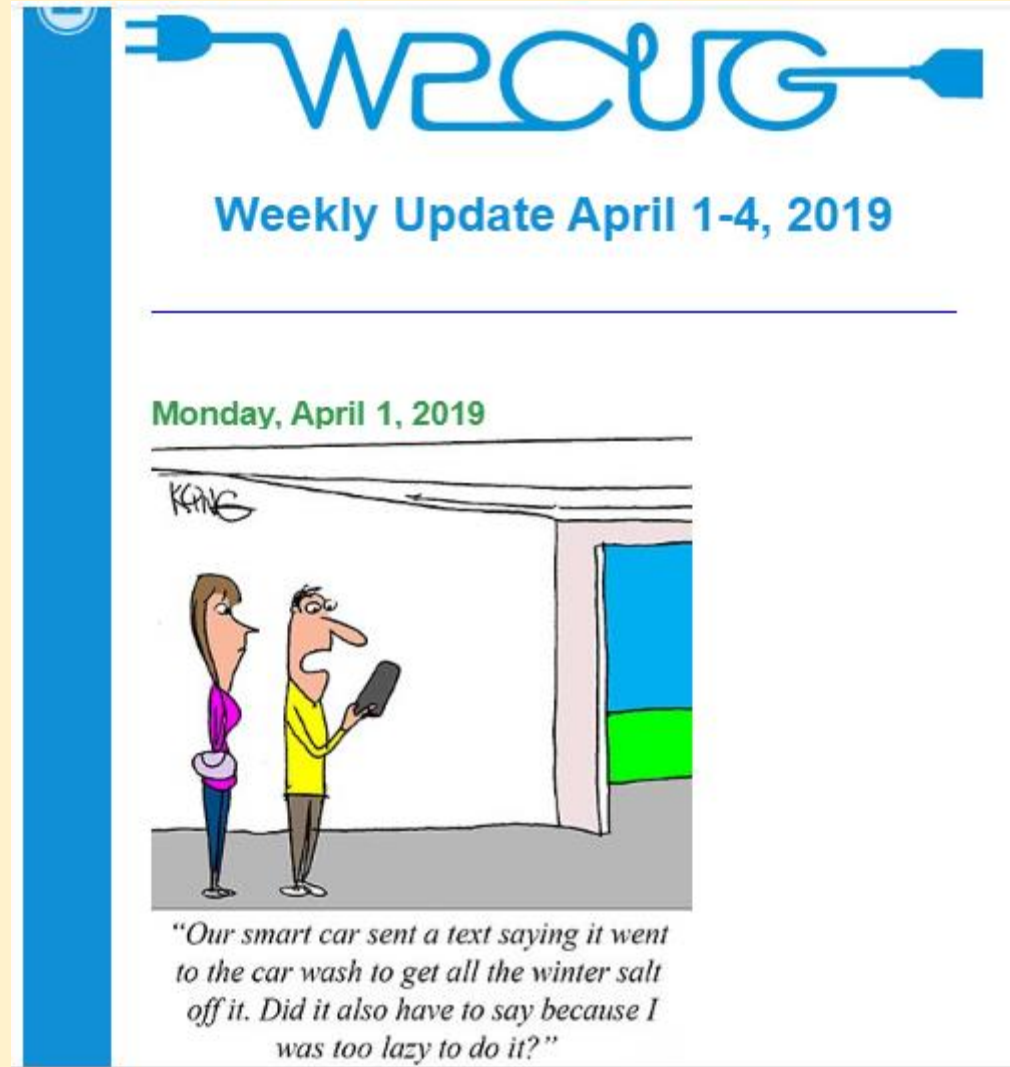
Microsoft retires Groove Music service, partners with Spotify
